- ✓ Bring your immersion suit and PFD so they can be checked. Your immersion suit will be used for the hands on safety practical.
- ✓ Wear closed toed shoes and long pants for firefighting/flare exercise.
- ✓ You will need a bathing suit, pants & a shirt (light colors) to wear in the pool.
- ✓ Bring a towel and a dry change of clothes.

The following people will need to pass a written safety exam (opened book) with 85% or better and correctly demonstrate how to: Make a MAYDAY call, Don an immersion suit in 60 seconds or less, Demonstrate how to install and manually launch a life raft, Demonstrate how to obtain expiration dates from an EPIRB, Demonstrate how to use your PLB and Demonstrate how to fill out the EVIC and PTVSC.
